## NOTICE TO APPLY FOR A FACULTY

Notice is hereby given that the Minister and Parish Council of the Anglican Parish of Church Hill would like to make the following alteration in Holy Trinity, Miller's Point (also known as the Garrison Church).

The change is as follows:

1. The proposed Renewal Project (Garrison Church) require the removal of the unused and unusable pipe organ of Holy Trinity, Miller's Point. (For some years an electronic organ has replaced the pipe organ for weddings and funerals.)
2. The pipe organ is unusable, and restoration has been priced and found to be uneconomical and sound quality unachievable.
3. The Organ Historic Trust of Australia, which is the authority for management of historic organs, has reviewed the organ and approved its removal from the Church.
4. It is proposed that parts of the organ (for example some of the pipes) will be used in an artistic form that honours the historic organ, and consultation has begun on this. The two plaques on the organ (one 1922 restoration dedicated to 'the Soldiers of the Parish who fell at the Great War' and to 'the late Rev. John Done', and the other marking a 1970 rededication) will be moved to a visible place, and on or close to the new display.

In accordance with the regulations under the Parish Administration Ordinance 2008 parishioners of this Church (the Garrison Church) can lodge objections with the Diocesan Registrar within 21 days from the date when this notice was first placed (from 4 August 2024). The Diocese is willing to receive comments from parishioners from St Philip's too.
